Paige Carlson (Southeastern Branch) is a fourth-year undergraduate student in the Department of Entomology and Nematology at the University of Florida. After encountering the staggering damage caused by the mountain pine beetle while on a family trip to Oregon, she became enthralled in entomology. Naturally, she was drawn back to the very system that initially peaked her interest and now works in the Forest Entomology and Symbiosis Lab under the direction of Dr. Jiri Hulcr. Currently, she is working to uncover the ways in which insects change natural landscapes. Specifically, her project aims to assess the effects of bark and ambrosia beetles on the fungal composition of pine trees. This spring, she will



graduate with her bachelor's degree and plans to pursue a graduate degree in entomology or plant pathology.

### **CONGRATULATIONS ELLIS JOHNSON!**

Ellis Johnson is currently a graduate student at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln (UNL). Ellis recently completed his undergraduate thesis in insect science from UNL under the mentorship of Dr. Joe Louis. For his undergraduate thesis, he utilized Arabidopsis thaliana to understand the basis of plant-aphid interactions. Specifically, his research focused on understanding the role of Arabidop is MPL1, a lipase-encoding gene, in providing defense to a specialist aphid. In addition, Ellis has served as an Undergraduate Teaching Assistant for multiple insect science courses. participated entomology outreach events, and assisted graduate students with various research studies. Ellis presented research at a UNL Undergraduate Science Fair and at the



2017 Kansas Entomological Society Annual meeting, where he was awarded first place at both events. He is eager to further his education in the field of entomology. Ellis wishes to pursue a career in academia, where he can share his passion for entomology.
