#### **Webcast Covers Bt Corn, Western Corn Rootworm**

**Mike Gray,** a professor and extension specialist in entomology at the University of Illinois, and his colleague **Joe Spencer,** an insect behavioralist, have launched "Corn Rootworm and Bt Corn," a two-part presentation on western corn rootworm biology and history, the use of Bt-transgenic corn, and survey results that suggest refuge compliance has been declining in recent years. <u>Full article</u>.
