

Research Entomologist (Post-doctoral Research Associate): The USDA-ARS Southern Insect Management Research Unit in Stoneville, MS is seeking an Entomologist (GS-11; \$62,236 to \$80,912) to work on the development of semiochemical-based trapping methods for insect pests of row crops. Opportunities also exist to work on insect-plant interactions and integrated pest management. The incumbent will conduct independent and cooperative research on the areas mentioned above. A Ph.D. in entomology, ecology, chemical ecology, or a related field of biology or chemistry is required.
