Two new insect common names were recently approved by the ESA Committee on Common Names and are being submitted to the ESA membership for comment. The common name spotted wing Drosophila, *Drosophila suzukii* (Matsumura), previously posted for member comment on 6/22/11, has been rescinded by the Committee on Common Names. The rationale for this decision was that there are concerns using the genus name Drosophila due to uncertain taxonomic revisions, and that spotted winged should be contracted to spottedwing in order to reflect the word's use as an adjective.
